Two Training Course on the Drug and Sensitivity Test (DST) for I and II anti-Tuberculosis Drugs

Under the overall guidance of the UNDP / GFATM Programme and in close collaboration with the NRL / NTP – MoH the International Consultant(s) / International Institute will assume the lead responsibility for providing the training required; the lab that will host the training, training requirements of training materials and consumables needed and the timely implementing of the final report The training courses should be designed as comprehensive and intensive courses that includes theoretical and practical trainings. The training courses agenda should cover - but not limited - the following aspects:

*Bacteriological and Molecular Diagnosis of TB.
Safety precautions for AFB microscopy, isolation and DST of M.Tuberculosis
Collection, transportation and receipt of specimens.
Culture isolation and M.Tuberculosis identification.
Traditional methods for DST.
Molecular methods for identification and DST.
Compliance with established quality assurance requirements.
Recording and reporting culture and DST results.
Infection Control methods and Procedures.*

At the end of the training the trainees should master:

- 1. Samples preparation.*
- 2. Media preparation.*
- 3. Inoculation on solid and liquid media for manual and automated culture and DST systems (MGIT960).*
- 4. DSTs on solid and liquid media (MGIT960).*
- 5. Decontamination and inoculation of samples.*
- 6. Molecular identification of M.Tuberculosis.*
- 7. Molecular DST on MTB.*
- 8. Plan of Action for EQA.*
